THE PUBLIC IS INVITED to this free celebration of books and book arts showcasing all facets of literary Southern Oregon. The Festival is an opportunity for area authors, publishers, and book artists to present, read and display their works. Tour the table fair, meet authors of all genres, and attend book readings, writing workshops, calligraphy demonstrations, and panel discussions about Shakespeare, book collecting, mystery and crime writing, and speculative fiction. Explore the library's Special Collections and view literary gems like Shakespeare's second and fourth folios. Bring your children! Kids can enjoy a variety of activities, like storytelling and book-making.

iPad Apps in the Government Stacks

SINCE FALL OF 2012 the Government Information Department has provided instruction sessions for University Seminar (USem) in the Government Publications stack area. Students are taught to use Hannon Library's iPads to access free federal government apps. Students search for both paper and electronic publications easily and email themselves PDF articles and reports for their research. In the fall, the pilot reached 183 students. By winter term the number of students served grew to 290.

During the class, students learn about the Hannon Library iPad check-out program and use the iPad for immediate research, finding books on the shelves, and finding electronic information provided by the government. Students leave the class with an understanding of the Federal Depository Library Program at SOU. Favorite apps include USA.gov for a general search of online government information, PubMed Mobile for full-text medical information, and the Smithsonian App, Meanderthal, which is just plain fun. Meanderthal allows the user to take a picture of a friend and transform the face into that of an early human. These and other free government apps can be found at the Mobile Apps Gallery at USA.gov (<http://apps.usa.gov/>).

When 189 students out of 10 classes were polled about their smart device usage, 78% reported using either an Apple or Android device. Now these students can access government information on their mobile devices on a regular basis.

Two New Digital Collections



Binary Bumblebees!

High-resolution images of eighty bumblebees from the SOU Insect Museum can now be viewed at Hannon Library's digital collections website. The SOU Insect Museum Digital Image Collection showcases images and field collection data of preserved insect specimens that were collected by students, researchers, and amateur collectors from the unique and diverse Klamath-Siskiyou forests ecoregion as well as from many other places around the world.

Viticultural Resource

Wine labels, photographs, and other items are being gradually added to the Wine of Southern Oregon digital collection and to Special Collections. Recognizing the importance of collecting and preserving the significant wine history of the Rogue and Applegate valleys, Hannon Library is reaching out to local wineries and vineyards. Enology and viticulture has long been a focus at Hannon Library and collections include 1,100 wine-related books, pamphlets, and ephemera as well as periodicals. Our efforts to preserve local wine history complement the efforts of others around the state, including the Oregon Wine History Archive established by Linfield College in 2011.



E-Resource Update

HANNON LIBRARY IS PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE TWO NEW E-RESOURCES

BizMiner provides access to thousands of industry financial and market reports at the national, state, county, and metro levels. The Industry Financial series contains financials for about 5,000 lines of business and the US Industry Market series provides detailed market statistics for about 6,000 lines of business at the national level. *BizMiner* also contains detailed market reports at the state, county, and metro level. The School of Business has provided the funds for this new valuable subscription aimed at business students and faculty.

Statistical Abstract of the U.S. is an authoritative and comprehensive summary of statistics on the social, political, and economic conditions of the United States. Previously provided as an annual one-volume book by the U.S. Census Bureau, this continually updated, searchable electronic format of the *Statistical Abstract of the U.S.* is available through a cooperative arrangement between the U.S. Census Bureau, Bernan Publishing, and ProQuest.

COMING SOON!

The following e-resources, paid for by the Friends of Hannon Library, will be available within the next few months:

National Geographic Magazine Archive, part of the new *National Geographic Virtual Library (NGVL)*, contains the complete archive of *National Geographic Magazine*, from the first issue in 1888 until 1994, with color images of all pages in the 1,224 issues, including 160,000 images, 465 map supplements, and detailed indexing of feature articles, map supplements, and advertisements.

Sage Deep Backfile new content will include the full-text of 37 additional journals with coverage beginning at Volume 1, Issue 1 of each title. Each year Sage acquires new journals and we have not updated our backfile for several years. Sage, an important academic publisher, provides journals that are particularly useful in the social sciences, but support all disciplines.

This year the Friends of Hannon Library spent nearly \$12,000 to purchase books and other library resources. Purchases this year include many expensive reference works including the Encyclopedia of School Crime and Violence (2 volumes), Dictionary of Latin American Cultural Studies, Routledge Handbook of Critical Criminology, Dirr's Encyclopedia of Trees and Shrubs, and Landmark Supreme Court Cases (3 volumes). The Friends of Hannon Library also purchased 27 books relating to Shakespeare and his times for the Margery Bailey Collection.

For the first time, the Friends purchased expensive e-resources that the library would have otherwise been unable to acquire. These include:

- National Geographic Magazine Archive is the comprehensive digital archive from the first issue in 1888 until 1994, with color images, maps, and searching features.
- Sage Deep Backfile provides the full-text of 37 journals from this important academic publisher with coverage beginning at Volume 1, Issue 1 of each title.
